Split the Pot Lottery

- Our Foundation is excited to partner with the Split the Pot Lottery in 2024. This is the largest partnered fundraising initiative in Ontario, with over 50 Ontario hospitals from across the province coming together to provide players with a groundbreaking way to win and support!

 - Cathy Telfer from Chatham won one of five \$10,000 prizes through the March 15th Early Bird draw






Igniting Healthcare 50/50 FUNdraiser


- Three more Igniting Healthcare 50/50 FUNdraisers are set to take place in 2024, with Spring, Summer and Holiday additions currently scheduled.





St. Clair College Thames Students Inc.

Spring Mail Appeal

- During the week of March 11th, we distributed our Spring Mail Appeal to approximately 2,500 target constituents from across our community.
- Through this appeal, we celebrated the success of the temporary seasonal care clinic that operated at CKHA over the winter months, reducing Emergency Room wait times by 15-20% by freeing up space in the Emergency Department during the seasonal surge of cold, flu, and respiratory illness.
- Just as the community's response to this service was very positive, we
 are also seeing positive feedback from this appeal, and the early returns
 have been very promising.

Quiet Room Grand Opening

- On January 23rd, we celebrated the unveiling of the new and enhanced Quiet Rooms in CKHA's inpatient psychiatry unit. These new rooms will provide a therapeutic space for patients where outside stimulus and exterior stressors are eliminated, and are designed with features that ensure patient and staff safety.
- This project was made possible thanks to significant support from local donors and organizations, including a \$10,000 grant from the Chatham Kent Community Foundation an additional \$10,000 donation from an anonymous donor, as well as a total of \$63,579.32 in funds raised through the Music for the Mind Fundraiser.
- We were so honoured to be joined for the ribboncutting ceremony by Elisha Banks (Founder, Music for the Mind), as well as Chris Pegg and Janine Griffore (Executive Director and Board Chair of Chatham Kent Community Foundation) for this exciting ribbon-cutting ceremony, and we are deeply grateful for their commitment to mental health and addictions care in our community.



Dialysis Donor Visit

- On March 20th, we were honoured to be joined by Ron, Sandra and Julia Peltier for a visit to the Dialysis Unit, which was recently outfitted with 12 new chairs.
