- Our Golf Tournament Online Auction wil run from May 27th to June 8th, and we look forward to building off the success of the past few years.

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

- We are so thankful for everyone who purchased 50/50 tickets, helping to make it such a huge success, and we look forward to launching our Summer 50/50 in late-June.



100 Men Who Care Chatham-Kent



- We also received great feedback from the newspaper ads the we ran in the Chatham Voice and the Southpoint Sun during our 50/50 campaign.




Social Media

We continue to grow our brand on social media, with a focus on Facebook, Instagram, and X (formerly Twitter). Facebook remains our top performing platform, as we saw a massive 884% increase in Total Impressions and a 408% increase in Total Reactions from March 18th to May 17th, compared to the same period last year. These massive increases can be attributed to an increased emphasis on producing compelling content, and a greater volume of posts promoting our Spring 50/50.
